cochino

cochino is incorrectly written and should be written as cochino/cochina being its meaning:
The Spanish word "Cochino" is a male hog/pig/swine. A sow is a "cochina". Because these animals are kept in pig-sties which are often unclean, when describing a person, a cochino/cochina refers to person who is dirty, filthy, unclean or slovenly.
