apostia

APOSTATIA (and not apostia) Action and Effect of quitting a religion or a political party to enter into another.

aquello

AQUELLO Adverb means THAT in an unpersonal way. Aquello es adecuado. That is adequate.

around

AROUND surrounding, near: around eight o'clock

battologist

BATTOLOGIST not a spanish word. BATOLOGIA or BATTOLOGY is the uncomfortable and irritating action of repeating words.

bermuda tryangle

BERMUDA TRYANGLE error for BERMUDA TRIANGLE

bochita

BOCHITA spanish diminutive of BOCHA small ball, normally made out of iron used in some old popular games.

bucaramangara

BUCARAMANGA is the name of the capital of Santander's Department in the north part of Colombia. People from Bucaramanga are called bucaramangues, búcaro or bumanguéño. There is no such a thing as Bucaramangara.

CASUALIDAD spanish for CHANCE

chato

CHATO in spanish formally, flattened colloquially, saturated, absolutely tired, exhausted Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be bored, tired , aburrido, cansado

chepa

CHEPA spanish for the external part of the genital female organs

chuchi

CHUCHI it has different spanish meanings according to the place and situation: in Argentina: 1 Beautiful and young lady 2. Lady who concurs to bars and night clubs to find men. 3. Afeminated man. In Spain: nice young lady, girlfriend In Paraguay: fine, elegant. In Chile: smart, experienced, intelligent (not common)

chumino

CHUMINO vulgarism for femenin sexual organs

colita

COLITA spanish for diminutive of TAIL, small tail. Coloquially, buttocks, ass. 2. A rest of something

compulsivo

COMPULSIVE Compulsivo Obsesive need to do something

concheta

CONCHETA spanish for shell; coloquially VULVA Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be concha, vulva, chucha

coño

COÑO spanish for VAGINA, pussy Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be pussy, vagina, chucha, raja

corneta

CORNETA formally, spanish for CORNET. Coloquially, penis. Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be cornet, penis

cromosómico

CROMOSÓMICO Spanish for CROMOSOMIC, related or pertaining to cromosomes

culo

CULO ASS

daga

DAGA White weapon, similar to a short spade.

eficiente

EFICIENTE Efficient

eluctable

ELUCTABLE in spanish is eludible evitable. In spanish there is the word ELUCTABLE meaning that it is possible to defeat it, to win (something) There is, on the other way, INELUCTABLE meaning unavoidable Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be evitable avoidable

europium

EUROPIUM chemical element atomic number 63. Europio in spanish.

falopa

FALOPA in spanish any alucinogenous drug

flauta

FLAUTA spanish for FLUTE

florales

FKORALES plural of FLORAL, related to the flowers.

fulano

FULANO A word used in replacement of any unknown person. if a second person is needed then is zutano. If a third, it is merengano.

gimpy

GIMPY afflicted with a limp or a limping walk.

gordito

GORDITO spanish for CHUBBY, diminutive of FAT Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be gordo, fat

grandeza

GRANDEZA greatness. Sometimes generosity.

grandura

GRANDURA spanish for GREATNESS

gravilla

GRAVILLA Gravel of less than 2 cms. In diameter, natural or manmade, used in unpaved roads, concrete mix, tennis courts, running fields and so on. Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be ripio, grava, gravilla, de tierra, gravel

indexación

INDEXACIÓN spanish for INDEXATION, 1. compensation of the value across a period of time by means of an interest rate or any other system.

2. Several methods for including the subjects of a website in the Internet index.

intercision

INTERCISION error for INTERCESIÓN to intercede, plea on the name of others.

klvp jriq iqjv eeap

Spam spam spam spam spam

libertina

LIBERTINO, A Libertine, a person who maintains permanent sexual relations with no limits whatsoever.

magro

MAGRO spanish for lean, poor Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be lean, poor

malandro

MALANDRO bad guy. Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be delincuente, truhán

mandadero

MANDADERO Messenger. Person who does small jobs on a churchill, office or a home.

moderno

MODERNO spanish for MODERN

nalgas

NALGAS spanish por BUTTOCKS Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be derriere, cachete, poto

ni verga

VERGA Dick phallus. Mi verga is my dick. Ni verga is neither dick...

novato

NOVATO spanish for rookie. Do not confuse eith NOVICIO, a NOVICE, person who learns to be a priest or a nun.

ocelotl

OCELOTL felis pardalis from nahuatl language, meaning OCELOT, a medium size american wildcat

padrino

PADRINO spanish for godfather

pawn

PAWN peón, a low level working man 2. a piece of the smallest value in the of the game of chess.

penetrada

PENETRADA Penetrated, fucked. Past participle of the verb PENETRAR, to penetrate 2. Entered.

pibix

PIBIX An ortographic error for PIVIX, an illustration communication service where people can post, read, and view illustrations, manga, and novel 2. Golf cleats

pipicito

PIPICITO Diminutive of (making)pee or pipi, urine. Hacer pipicito is to orinate, preferably by small childrens.

piruja

PIRUJA young, free and open woman 2. Prostitute 3. A person who does not serve all religious obligations. Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be willing woman, sapling

pulcro

PULCRO spanish for NEAT, TIDY, SPOTLESS

rango

RANGO Range, position. Order or level. Militar de alto rango: High range officer

redimente

REDIMENTE (something, someone) who redeems, that makes free, gives freedom

rocosa

ROCOSA adj. Rocky

rotales meaning

ROTALES It is the second person singular of the Imperative mode of the verb ROTAR, (TO ROTATE) in a pronominal form. The suffix -LES means A ELLOS, that is to them. So, finally, ROTALES means ROTATE THEM

si se puedes

SI SE PUEDES orthographic error for the expression SI SE PUEDE. According to the intonation SI SE PUEDE! means a conviction that (something) IS POSSIBLE. When is said in an interrogative tone is an ask for permission (to do something)

socio

SOCIO spanish for partner

tirar

TIRAR Colloq. To fuck. Fornicate.2. Pull: Tira de la palanca: Pull the lever.. 3. Throw away This food is not fresh. Throw it away. Esta comida está descompuesta. Tírala a la basura.

token

TOKEN informatics: sensible data which is replaced by an unsensible value, named token Some synonyms, words or similar expressions can be fictitious, fake value

trasero

TRASERO spanish for bottom, bum, rear

undervse

UNDESERVE inmerecer. no merecer

unengaged

UNENGAGED No comprometido, sin compromisos. Said of a person with no affective compromise

valiente

VALIENTE spanish for BRAVE, COURAGEOUS

vegetable

VEGETABLE Vegetal

vulva

VULVA Venus mount, femenin intimate external sexual organ

xuxa

XUXA brasilian singer, Tv conductor, model, actress, famous for a kids TV show made in spanish, english and portuguese.. Do not confound with CHUCHA which is colloquial for vagina or vulva. Both words are pronounced similarly in spanish.

zorra

ZORRA Bitch, prostitute, fox
