ayudable

Susceptible to be helped (-a).

beterrada

1. (F. Beetroot) A chenopodiácia herbaceous plant that has a purplish-red root whose fruit is edible. 2. Edible tuber in the shape of a bulb, which is actually a Spanish variant of beetroot. 3. Variant of betarraga, possibly an archaism coming from the Portuguese betarraba. 4. In Mexico Betabel.

chácaro

1. Adj. In Venezuela it refers to the town crier. 2. Their. Muchacho (in the Eastern Plains in Colombia). 3. Their. Variant of cañandonga (in Dominican Republic).

en estado de intemperancia

It refers to the state in which a subject gives free rein to their desires or emotions, positive or negative, without any restrictions.

fangirling

English expression denoting a person's fanaticism for something.

infantes

1. In Spain, it denotes the king's legitimate son who is not part of the line of succession to the throne. 2. Adj. Child (-a) under seven years.

insignificantes

1. Adj. Pl. It denotes that a matter, person, or thing is of little value or importance. 2. Adj. Pl. Very small or relevant.

intertextualidad

Term coined by Julia Kristeva that denotes the implicit or explicit relationship that exists between some texts.

mi llavería

Familiar expression very popular on the Colombian Atlantic coast that is used to refer to a close friend.

no echar saco rato

Expression that refers to not wasting an opportunity.

supraordinar

A mental process involved in understanding which class (gender) a given concept belongs to.

tarado imbécil

Adj. Person who denotes some degree of deficiency in their mental abilities or who behaves as such.

tener las de perder

Expression that denotes that all possibilities are against. Some synonyms, words or similar expressions may be all to lose
