pejiguero

Pejiguero/a is a colloquial adjective that refers to something or someone, such as annoying, heavy or with the pretensions of a demanding person.

peláncano

It is said of a noun, masculine of colloquial use and of derogatory context, since it refers in a dismissive way to someone's hair or oneself.

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peluchar

It is a simile to when you cut off all the hair of an animal or person. It is applied when everything available is lost in a short space of time, mainly objects or personal belongings such as money or housing, leaving the person who loses it "naked".

pensamiento mágico

It is said in a way of arriving at conclusions based on supernatural assumptions, which does not enter into the current scientific laws. It is inherent in the unconscious and relies on intuitive knowledge and analogical reasoning to form judgments and opinions.

pentavocálica

It is said of words that contain five vowels (the prefix penta-, of Greek origin, means five) without repetition of the same vowels.

perinola

3. Ornament in the shape of a spinning top.

perruquería

A neologism that describes in a word the hairdressers dedicated to animals, mainly dogs.

persecución por motivos de género

It is said, especially in the field of human rights and migration, that it is based on the concept of persecution, defined in the field of asylum as the serious or sustained or systematic violation of human rights; Gender-based persecution occurs when these rights violations are related to the role assigned to a person because of their gender identity (female, male, trans, or other) or because of their sexual preferences. Discrimination or less favourable treatment may amount to persecution and require international protection.

perspectiva de género

It refers to seeing or analysing an economic, social, cultural phenomenon, etc., addressing the differentiated impact that it can have on women in terms of opportunities, roles and social interactions.

pesticidas

Plural of pesticide. It is a substance that is used to combat pests in crops and homes, among others.

petofilia

It is said of the term of new use that describes a person's love for animals in general and their pet in particular.

philia

According to the ancient Greeks, it would be a type of love based on friendship, it would then be love understood as friendship, which demands nothing but betrayal.

picarón

Picarón/a. It is said of the adjective, used colloquially, that describes a person who behaves in a burlesque manner while at the same time an erotic tone towards the person(s) to whom it is addressed.

pico o palillo de pan

Also known as "colín", it is a food made of bread without crumbs, thus being hard but crunchy, ideal to accompany with cheese, sausage or for dipping.

piedrecita en el zapato

An expression that amounts to saying something that bothers or makes you uncomfortable, often in a subtle but persistent way.

piramidoide

It is a word whose etymology comes from the noun "pyramid" and the Greek suffix "oide", from the Greek root "eidos" which indicates in the form of . Therefore, it is that object, person or thing that contains the shape of a pyramid.

piroquinésis

It is said of a mental ability that allows the possessor to be able to control the element of fire at will.

pisoplón

It is said of a large and luxurious apartment similar to a mansion but located in a building. It is often said in a derogatory sense

pitiuso

Pitiusa or pituso, is a related adjective to describe the Balearic Islands.

plaquetaféresis

It's also called "platelet apheresis" and it's platelet donation through apheresis blood donation, where a machine separates and collects the platelets and returns the rest of the blood components, along with some saline. You can donate up to 24 times in a year and the restrictions are very similar to those of a regular blood donation.

plasmaféresis

Also known as "apheresis plasma" donation. During plasma donation, blood is drawn from one arm and a machine separates and collects the selected components, only plasma or a combination of plasma and platelet units, and then

returns the rest of the blood components with some saline.

platonópolis

Name of the city that the philosopher and mystic Plotinus tried to found, unsuccessfully, in present-day Italy. The idea was of a city of philosophers to bring to reality the Platonic ideal state.

pleroma

A word of Greek origin that means fullness or fullness. Pleroma is understood as the element common to many Gnostic doctrines and philosophies, being the origin and primordial unity from which the rest of the elements that exist, including the beings that inhabit the universe, arise.

plugir

A disused verb that describes the physical, psychic, or spiritual enjoyment produced by performing or perceiving some pleasant or pleasurable event.

plural expresivo

In Spanish, there is this type of plural, which does not denote quantity, but intensity, as with "gracias" or "saludos".

pluviofilia

It is said of love, taste or fascination for rain; Feeling of peace and happiness that arises in a person when it rains.

pneumatóforo

1 . It is a structure present in the roots of certain plants that grow in swampy or flooded areas. 2 . In mysticism, especially Christianity, this is the name given to the bearers in the world of the fire of the Spirit.

pocket

Its meaning in English is "pocket", but it is not a word used in Spanish, not even as an anglicism, nor is it necessary to incorporate it into the Spanish language.

podofilia

Taste and fascination for the feet, due to different factors, such as the shape and size, or that of the toes, footwear, body odor or sexual interaction with them, occurs especially in heterosexual men.

pogonofobia

It is said of the fear that many people feel towards beards. These people are disgusted by all types of facial hair and especially by longer and/or fuller beards.

politoxicomanía

It is said of the disorder that makes the person who suffers from it throughout his addicted life, develop the habit of combining, in short periods (every night, every weekend), the consumption of different narcotics, in order to achieve in this way, various psychological, physical and emotional effects.

por la cacha de la espada

A phrase used to conclude an enumeration of things of different kinds, to devalue what has been previously

enumerated, downplaying its importance. It's the burlesque version of "etcetera."

positivizar

It is a transitive verb, which expresses the highlighting or giving a positive character to some idea, person, situation or thing.

posmachismo

It is said of a type of modern machismo, which arises in societies where equality between men and women has advanced and which react against non-language. Unlike traditional machismo, they practice a more subtle form of machismo, less <pri>primitiva>> and their discourse is usually more politically correct in the forms and thus get a wider audience.

posmoderno

In a more general sense, it describes the rupture and blurring of the canons, categories and limits established with respect to modernity.

posthumanismo

De post means "after" and "humanism", referring to the human, i.e. "beyond the human species". Thus, it is a philosophy that advocates the use of technology to evolve the human species, without the need for natural selection; It is then an artificial selection, in which another species is evolved that is different from and superior to the human one.

potestades

In angelology, they become the angelic chorus of the middle hierarchy, along with virtues and dominations. They are angels who are responsible for maintaining the balance of the universal creation, mediating between the spiritual and physical worlds, and between the higher and lower hierarchies of the Divine realm.

presahariano

It is said of a person who is born and/or lives in countries above the Sahara Desert, such as Morocco or Algeria, among others.

presentismo

3. It is said of the action and effect of being present. 4. Try to project the values of the present onto the past.

preuniverso

It is said of the concept that seeks to find out "what" was before the formation of the current universe in which we find ourselves; It's a booming concept given the questioning of the Big Bang. According to the most physics-related versions, the preuniverse must have been a dark fog of matter and energy, and must have been cold. Matter had to be composed of hydrogen, nitrogen, iron and aluminum, the latter possibly one of the most abundant elements before the formation of our planet earth along with hydrogen and nitrogen. From a more philosophical point of view, there may be an approach that there could not really have been a "before" since perhaps there has never been a beginning, or it is considered to be a whole continuum of an evolutionary type, or one more universe among millions of other possible universes, more along the lines of infinity.

primaverano

It is said to be an acronym for spring and summer, which describes the period of spring with weather more typical of summer, especially due to the heat.

principados

In angelology, it is the order of angels who form the seventh heavenly choir. Principalities are the guardians of nations. They oversee events that affect nations, including politics, military issues, and trade

proenvejecimiento

Also written as pro-aging, it is the attitude of changing the negative mindset to a positive one in the aging process and the consequences that come with it; It is recommended to have this attitude from the age of 40.

proestadounidense

It is said of that person who is an admirer of the United States of America. The prefix cpro>> is prefixed to adjectives
and nouns to denote a favorable attitude toward what they express.

proguerra

Attitude or firm will to promote war as a solution to conflicts, to maintain a kind of preventive security or to profit through armed conflicts.

prontos

A colloquial noun, it means those sudden and surprising annoyances that a person suffers in a certain stressful situation.

psiconaútica

Literally "navigating consciousness" is a set of many trance techniques from any of the world's religions, modern psychology or other paradigms, to explore the mind, and thus understand its meaning, and potentially improve the functioning of the psyche of the user who practices it.

psicopatocracia

It is said of a neologism that literally means "power of psychopaths" and comes to be a concept with an aspect and intention of criticism towards the rulers and their actions that people contemplate with astonishment and of which there is no explanation of why they are so unjust, of why they have forgotten the common good. What motives move them to gorge themselves on privileges, why they abuse power and wallow in corruption, as if they were, in effect, psychopaths without any remorse for the people they should wish for their well-being and yet mistreat.

psiónica

It is said of the idea about the human mind in which <psiónica>he calls > the power to influence the environment and itself and sometimes other minds, through concentration and will. </psiónica>

psiónico

Psionic . It is said of a person with extraordinary mental qualities. They can be found in both parapsychology and in both science fiction and fantasy literature. See: psionics.

puesta al día

Adjectival verbal locution, applied to a person or thing that is up-to-date with respect to its function or knowledge, are in the first row of innovations that arise at any given time.

pulpear

2. Groping or touching another person excessively.

quedao

A colloquially used noun, which has two meanings: 1. About a person who is very distracted, without enough concentration to find out what is happening, sometimes because of drunkenness or drugs. 2. A person who does not study or work, usually due to laziness or lack of motivation rather than lack of opportunities.

quedarse al margen

An expression that comes to say of a person who does not get involved in a problem or critical situation that does not concern him directly.

quesear

3. It is said to make cheeses; action of a cheesemaker.

quietismo

2. It is said of the doctrine of some Christian mystics, and is considered a heterodoxy. His teaching is that the supreme perfection of the soul of the human being is the annihilation of one's own will in order to unite with God, in passive contemplation and indifference to everything that may happen to him in such a state.

quilofagia

It is said of the act of biting one's lips, often unconsciously; Depending on the context, it can be a gesture of desire or, almost the opposite, the product of a nervous stimulus.

quinetoscopio

Also called kinetoscope or kinetoscope, it is a device that was the precursor of the film projector or cinema, although the device was not a projector itself, it came to create the illusion of movement by transporting a strip of perforated film with sequential images on a light source.

racializar

It is said of a neologism that is particularly used as a participle: racialized -da. It is used as an adjective, with the sense of classifying, identifying, or differentiating people based on their belonging to a type of ethnic group.

racismo absoluto

Absolute or total racism is that which is the state itself that organizes itself according to racist and supremacist positions, applying policies of segregation, use of violence, exclusion of those who are different, etc. The extreme case is known as "ethnic cleansing".

racismo fragmentado

It is said of a type of racism whose influence and strength is more evident than in infraracism, it still continues to present itself in disguise especially in the media and social networks. encouraging discrimination against different groups.

racismo político

It is said of the type of racism in which the manifestations are present, it is the racism that becomes a principle of action and objective of a political force, which attacks the difference and the supposed hierarchy of one group over another through practices and discourses.

raja yoga

Some ancient Sanskrit writings portray Raja yoga as the ultimate goal of yoga, rather than being a set of physical and mental actions and practices. This means that Raja is sometimes interpreted as the condition of harmony and self-discipline that accompanies the practice of yoga and meditation.

recogida de cable

A colloquial expression that expresses the rectification or retraction of an opinion, usually out of convenience rather than conviction.

recordatorio amistoso

A concept that is commonly used in emails or social media messages. They are characterized by being brief, with a conciliatory tone and serve as a gentle reminder for a simple request. Formality in these circumstances depends on how well the recipient is known. It is recommended to use it instead of the unnecessary anglicism "Friendly reminder".

reducetarianismo

It refers to the movement and/or policy proposal that aims to reduce the consumption of animal-based foods and their derivatives in the human diet.

reducetariano

Reducetarian: Said of the person who practices reducetarianism. Pertaining to or relating to reducetarianism.

regalo de espanto

Every noun accompanied by the phrase "of horror" adds repulsion, rejection and disgust. Therefore, a gift of horror is a gift that seems horrifying to the person who receives it.

reptiliano

1. Reptilian quality. 2. Also known as reptiloid, lizardmen or draconians, they are fantastic humanoid reptiles, which appear in fantasy and/or science fiction literature; In ufology/ufology an extraterrestrial race is called this and in certain conspiracy theories, they have bad intentions towards humanity.

resultadismo

Doctrine, frequent in sports and especially in football or football, which gives preference to achieving a good result over any other aesthetic aspect of the game and therefore tends to give only predominant importance to results.

retrofuturismo

This is the name given to the set of artistic expressions that find their origin between the longing for the past and the desire for a future (or present) better than the one that is lived and that are therefore influenced by the enthusiasm of utopians, eutopians or dystopians about an imaginary future. In short, retrofuturism is today's vision of yesterday's imagined future, for a world of tomorrow that has never been.

retrolución

A neologism that serves to summarize in a single word the ideology and politics of the alt-right (since it is in the United States where it was born, developed and expanded to the rest of the world, mainly Western). Unlike the neo-Nazi groups of the past, or the Tea Party movement of the Obama era, this is a group whose leaders show great intellectual refinement, and who, through the colonization of the discourse of the alternative left of the 1960s (especially the Frankfurt School), are carrying out a renewal of far-right political thought. Hence, by selling a retrograde revolution, the

word retrolution is formed.

retrorrevolución

It is said of the political current that seeks, with revolutionary measures, to return to an economic and social system prior to the one we have today, with a return to the past (usually idyllic) and against technologies or ideas of modernity or postmodernity.

reunión grupal

These are meetings in which the participants have a specific profile, the appropriate one for each situation (from informal meetings, research meetings or meetings of professionals or experts in a given sector).

revolución científica

It is said of the drastic change in the model of Western thought that took place between the fifteenth and seventeenth centuries, during the beginning of the Modern Age. Thus, it forever changed the views of the Middle Ages, both about nature, the universe, God and life.

risasco

It is said of the reaction to a situation or phenomenon in which it produces in the person a mixture of laughter and, in turn, disgust at what he has seen and/or heard.

ristar

A character in a video game of the same name. It is an anthropomorphic shooting star with white and yellow sneakers, wears gloves and is rounded in shape. He can jump and defeat his enemies by grabbing enemies with his extendable arms by "crashing" them into himself.

robollamadas

It is said of a type of telephone call from an unknown number, in which when you pick up there is a silence and perhaps (although not always) after a few seconds, a brief word of farewell. They are telephone calls executed by automated telemarketer robots for this purpose, and they are the prelude to a call from a person, who will finally be in charge of executing the commercial operation to convince you to buy, acquire a product or adhere to an offer.

roles de género

It is said of social norms and behaviors that, within a specific culture, are widely accepted as socially appropriate for people of a specific sex. They usually determine the responsibilities and tasks traditionally assigned to men, women, boys and girls.

ronear

It is said of showing off, strutting, courting or what is colloquially understood as flirting with another person; It comes from Caló, the gypsy language.

runrún

3. In a colloquial sense, it is understood as the voice that runs through the audience. 4. In Chile and Peru: A toy that spins and produces a buzzing sound. 5. In Chile: It is a bird with black plumage, with white shirts, that lives near the banks of rivers.

sacar provecho

A phrase that comes to say about something, that it is given the maximum performance or is extremely profitable for those who use it, using it effectively.

saiyajin

Also known as Saiyan, it is the name of an extraterrestrial race, hailing from the planet Vegeta. It is one of the most powerful races in the manga and anime Dragon Ball; characters like Goku. Vegeta or Broly belong to the .

saiyan

Also known as Saiyan, it is the name of an extraterrestrial race, being the main one in the manga and anime Dragon Ball; Main characters, such as Goku or Vegeta, belong to the Saiyan race.

samanda

It is both a masculine and feminine name and is of Hebrew origin; Its meaning is "to hear, to hear".

sanguinismo

It refers to one of the four character types based ?? in ancient Greek ideology. This type of temperament is usually characterized by high levels of energy and optimism.

se te va la olla

A colloquial expression used to describe someone who has gone mad for a short period of time or who has committed or is about to commit some irrational act.

seguero

It is said of the person who is an admirer, follower or who is fascinated by video game consoles, games, etc. From the Japanese multinational company dedicated to the creation of video games, Sega.

semimate

It is said a type of paint finish, which lies somewhere in between matte and satin finish.

ser arrogante

It is said of an attitude that consists of being haughty, conceited, boastful, arrogant, believing that he is always right and also conceited. "Being arrogant becomes ignorant" because he believes he is an expert in all subjects, issues and situations, therefore he does not learn from others, having no interest in listening to other people.

ser cabeza dura

It is said of a person who finds it difficult to change his mind. Synonymous with stubborn.

ser de puño cerrado

It is said of someone who is stingy, stingy, unwilling to pay or share expenses, usually monetary.

ser más largo que un día sin pan

It is said of any situation or event, which is of excessive duration.

ser más pesado que una vaca en brazos

It is said of someone who is annoying or unbearable, who causes mental fatigue with those around him.

ser vivo

A living being is a set of atoms and molecules, which form a very organized and complex material structure, and in which molecular communication systems intervene, and through this it manages to relate to the environment in which it is found, resulting in an exchange between matter and energy in an orderly way. A living being has the ability to perform the basic functions of life, which are nutrition (they feed themselves to get enough energy to live), the ability to relate (they react to the information they receive from the environment around them). And finally reproduction, whose function is to perpetuate the species or lineage.

sergio

A masculine name derived from the ancient Latin nobleman Sergius (name of a Roman gens). Of Etruscan origin, it comes from serving, saving, guarding, caring, and therefore means "to keep, guardian, protect".

serval

It is a wild cat from the African savannah. By its appearance it looks more like a small cheetah. With a shoulder height between 54 and 62 centimeters and a length of up to one meter, the serval female weighs between 9 and 12 kilos.

simetrofobia

It is said that people with symmetry have an irrational and unhealthy fear of symmetry and symmetrical things.

sin pareja

A composite synonym for singleness; the status of the bachelor; A person who, by decision or obligation, does not have a romantic relationship with another person.

sincronicidad

A concept that psychiatrist Carl G . Jung coined the term and refers to "the simultaneity of two events linked by meaning but in a non-causal way", that is, the union of inner and outer events in a way that cannot be explained but has some meaning for the person who observes it.

sinecismo

Said to refer, in Ancient Greece, to the political and territorial union of two groups of populations; They were produced either by domination or by seeking to strengthen the economic and financial situation of a city and/or urban or military needs.

sinecoide

Characteristic connection of a term "X" with a set of terms (A, B, C, etc.) when "X" must necessarily be linked, but alternatively, to one or more of the terms in that same set, but not to any of its particular terms.

sintiencismo

This is the name given to the intersection between veganism and naturalism. Jamie Woodhouse is the one who has used this term to interpret and redefine something very similar to veganism. It is a philosophy that uses evidence and reason to determine what to believe, but it also has compassion for every sentient being. It is similar to certain theses of Buddhism and especially Jainism.

sisifemia

It is said of a new type of disorder, which occurs in a work environment, where obsession, ambition, self-demand and perfectionism, exceed the ability of the sufferer to handle it, which causes discomfort, stress, etc.

síndrome de diógenes

This is the name given to the pathology that a person suffers, which leads them to accumulate objects obsessively and compulsively, resulting over time from a serious problem of hygiene, coexistence and health.

síndrome de noé

It is said of the disorder or pathology that a person suffers that, compulsively, leads to the accumulation of animals, usually domestic, degenerating in the care of these animals, being therefore a harmful behavior for them. Not to be confused with petophilia.

síndrome de rebeca

It is said to be a type of syndrome in which jealousy arises from a person towards the ex-partners of his or her current partner.

sobrao

Colloquial expression or vulgarism, it is applied to people who either have a lot of confidence in themselves or have material goods in excess.

sobrerregalar

It is said of the act of giving too much to a particular person or group, to the point of exaggeration, usually for the selfish purposes of seeking favors or pardons on the giftee.

socerafobia

It is said of fear, dread or rejection of in-laws.

sofocracia

It is said of the type of government in which power and decisions are made by a group or assembly of wise men.

somatización

It is said of the disorder whose fundamental symptom is the appearance of some type of physical pain without a medical cause, that is, due to psychological factors. The main cause is an excess of obsessive thoughts around the physical illness, as well as a tendency to feel anxious and to dramatize signs of physical discomfort or discomfort.

soricomorfo

It is said of the order of placental mammals that contains shrews and moles. Small in size in proportion to the rest of the mammals, among them are the lightest mammals that exist, such as the shrew.

sororato

This is the custom by which a widower marries the sister of the deceased wife.

sororicidio

It is said of the crime committed by a person who kills a brother. Murder or manslaughter perpetrated against a sister.

stalinismo

It is said of the type or current of communist thought, which, unlike its predecessors, defended "socialism in one country", banishing the internationalist essence of socialism and communism. It owes its name to Joseph Stalin, a Soviet dictator who imposed his rule through terror and murder, and who propelled the USSR as the second world power in the 20th century. It is also spelled in Spanish as "Stalinism".

subnutrición

It is said of chronic food insecurity, in which the intake of food does not cover the basic and necessary energy needs on a continuous basis, which causes a state of weakness in the person.

suelo pegajoso

It refers to the tasks of care and family life to which women have traditionally been relegated. This concept is related to the famous "balance" of work and outside the home, so complicated for many women to maintain.

sueños lúcidos

It is said of those dreams in which the dreamer is aware that he is dreaming, being able to participate in it as he pleases.

sumatorio

Summation . It is said of the mathematical expression that expresses the notation that shows the sum of the numerical terms of a sequence between two definite limits .

supraorbitario

It is said of the term that is used, mainly in medicine, to describe any structure that is above or above the orbit of the eye.

suprarracional

It is said of that type or object that is beyond the possibilities of knowledge of reason, which, unlike the irrational, does not contradict it, but starts from it in order to reach a broader vision of the knowledge of reality.

taasofobia

It is said of the feeling of fear of sitting, waiting seated, or having the feeling of wasting time sitting.

tabloide

2. In a derogatory way, it is used to describe a newspaper or news of a sensationalist or sensationalist nature.

tanatoquinesis

It is a mental capacity, typical of fantasy or science fiction stories, in which the possessor can cause the death of a living being at the instant of thinking about it, being therefore a very dangerous power.

taoísmo

It differentiates two types of Taoism, the so-called philosophical Taoism (known as Tao-Chia which is understood as

"School" or rather as "group professing a doctrine") and the second is Religious Taoism (Tao-chiao). Philosophical Taoism refers to the works of Lao-tzu* (Tao-te ching) and Chuang-tzu, considered its founders, and of Lie-tse and Yang-Chu, its continuators. The aim of its adherents is a mystical union with the Tao through meditation and assimilation to the nature of the Tao in thinking and acting. Representatives of religious Taoism, on the other hand, are more specifically interested in the attainment of immortality.

tapas

Typical dish for snacks, with a wide variety of flavors and types of cooking. In some areas of Spain, they are usually given for free when ordering a drink.

tapería

It is said of the bar or restaurant where they mainly serve "tapas", typical dishes of all kinds prepared especially for snacks.

taumatrópo

It is a cardboard disc that rotated on its axis by means of ropes that were tied to its ends, on both sides of the disc there were different but complementary images. Usually the drawings that were usually used in this type of toys were of animals and to achieve the illusion of movement the strings of the thaumatrope had to be pulled with the fingers

tálpido

Thalpids are mammals commonly known as moles. About the size of a rat, most live in burrows and have very limited vision, without ever being blind.

technosexual

Expression used to designate those people who make use of their sexuality through technology, either through viewing images of erotic content or through other practices in which technological advances are necessary to carry it out.

techo de diamante

It refers to the fact that, in patriarchal societies, men are considered an "object of appreciation" and women an "object of desire", thus subordinating them to a situation in which men perpetuate their power. The 'diamond ceiling' prevents women from being valued on the basis of strictly professional criteria.

tecnomanía

It is said of the obsession with everything related to technology and its advances, having blind faith in everything that comes from it.

tecnoquinesis

It is said of the very rare ability of some people who tend to have a lot of contact with technology and can manipulate it in an extraordinary way. Technokinesis would then be the ability to control electronic devices without touching them and to be able to communicate with them in some way, intuiting what is happening to them or how they work, being able, too, to fix them in a "magical" way.

tecnorrealismo

Thinking that seeks to mediate between technology and its advances along with humanistic values, thus seeking the balance between technology and society. It is also known as the "third culture"

telempatía

It is said of a mental ability, which allows the user who possesses it, the ability to feel the emotions and feelings of a person of his choice, even to be able to influence those emotions from a distance.

televidenta

It could be meant as "Woman contemplating images broadcast on television". However, it is not necessary to use the feminine in viewership, which is neutral and is used interchangeably for the masculine and feminine.

tener mano derecha

The expression to have a right hand means to be the most trusted and helpful person for another and is usually applied in the workplace.

tener muchas bocas que llenar

A colloquial expression that says about someone who has many family responsibilities, which depend on that person for their subsistence.

teobiocentrismo

It is said of a subcurrent of biocentrism, which emphasizes respect and/or love for God in order to give a spiritual meaning to the ethics proposed by biocentrism, respecting the living beings that are part of the creation of the Divine.

teobiocentrista

He is said to be a defender of theobiocentrism. Pertaining to or relating to theobiocentrism.

teopático

Affective state of mysticism in which it has the sensation of being in the permanent identification of indissoluble union with God, and that contemplation became active, leaving the incompatibility between contemplation and action

teoría del caos

An approach that states that the outcome of an event depends on several variables and that the behavior of these variables cannot be predicted with total precision. And according to its proponents, this imprecision appears in all circumstances and forms of life.

teosis

Also spelled colo theosis, it is synonymous with deification, which describes a radical transformative process whose end is likeness or union with God, as taught in the Christian religion.

teóforo

God-bearer or divinely related, from an object such as a totem or beings such as angels and even human beings.

terraformación

It is a scientific hypothesis, in which it proposes a process aimed at deliberately modifying the atmosphere, temperature, topography or ecology of a planet or natural satellite to resemble the Earth's environment and create the minimum environmental conditions for terrestrial life, mainly human. This concept is based on planetary engineering, which is the application of technology to change the conditions of a planet.

terraformar

It refers to the action of terraforming on a planet or satellite, to make it habitable for human beings and other living beings of terrestrial origin.

tiburonear

1. It is said of unscrupulous behavior, of acting according to one's own needs without consideration for others. 2. In Cuba, it is mainly used to describe the action of establishing a relationship, usually of a sexual nature, with another person. Synonymous with flirting or conquering in an amatory sense.

tiburoneo

Sharking action.

tiranizante

It is said of that activity and/or action caused with excessive domination, typical of a tyrant or similar.

titania

2 . It is the largest moon of Uranus, the eighth most massive in the solar system. Titania is formed by an accretion disk around the planet Uranus, also known as Uranus III.

toma el tupé

A colloquial phrase that means to joke or deceive someone with flattery, promises, or praise.

tortillear

1. Make omelettes with eggs, corn flour or wheat flour. 2. Colloquially said of a sexual relationship between two or more women.

tragasable

It is said in a colloquial way of calling a person a felatomaniac, it is usually used with the intention of offending.

tramología

It is said of the study of each of the parts, stages or sections into which a linear extension can be divided, whether material or not, and is applied in an artistic, historical or literary work.

transhumanismo

A philosophical and cultural movement that defends human improvement both physically and mentally, thus transcending the limitations that nature has granted to human beings.

transoñante

It is said of that person who habitually manages to be conscious in dreams, that is, to have lucid dreams, thus being able to transcend them. There are several levels of transdreamer, depending on their dreamlike lucidity.

transparenticidio

It is a humorous neologism, which links the word suicide with transparent, and is understood as "death for being transparent". It is used when a fact is confessed without mincing words, without thinking too much about the

consequences of being excessively transparent, which causes some kind of wake-up call, retaliation or offense according to or disproportionate. It is similar to the concept, also comical, of "sincericide"

transversalidad

This concept refers to the need for the reality in the various social, cultural, educational, political or economic spheres to be analysed taking into consideration that men and women are not in the same social position and that this different position determines the effects they will have on each gender, generally to the detriment of women.

trascendencia

3. It is said of that which lies beyond the limits of Nature, of that which surpasses it.

trianguloide

In the language of geometry, it is said about a body of similar shape to the triangle.

tribus

Plural of tribe, which is a group of people united in a particular location, usually related by kinship or blood lineage.

tricerebral

According to Paul McLean's theory, the human brain is divided into three parts: reptilian brain, limbic brain, and neocortex; Each of them represents instinct, emotions, and rational process, respectively.

trihexafobia

The phobia is said to be the number six hundred and sixty-six (666), which is popularly known as the Devil's number.

trilerismo

It is said of the art of deception, to swindle, in an unethical way, using all available means that aid deception.

tristísimo

Superlative adjective of sad; that is exceedingly sad or causes deep sadness.

tríclope

It is said of a type of humanoid creature that possesses three eyes, usually the third of the eyes is usually on the forehead of the individual.

tronos

In angelology, they constitute the first angelic hierarchy along with the cherubim and seraphim. This Chorus symbolizes serenity of judgment, contemplating and worshipping God. They are the ones who are attentive to the reasons for God's action.

tróspido

It is a neologism, being an adjective that comes to express something or someone that is extravagant, strange, especially in a negative sense. Which in English is "weird".

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truficultura

It is said of the cultivation of truffles, which consists of planting trees in whose roots the hyphae of the truffle fungus is inoculated so that they are mycorrhizal. Truffles are associated with a large number of trees, the vast majority of which are woody, such as holm oak, common or pubescent oak, kermes oak or hazelnut or hazelnut tree.

turanismo

It is said of the political movement, of a fascist type, that all peoples considered > claim for themselves <túrquicos>, from Turkey itself, through the southern part of the Balkans and to Afghanistan and China in the east. Like Nazism, they consider themselves part of a master race and their ultimate goal is the creation of a Great Turkic Empire, which they refer to as the <Reino de="" turán="">>>. </Reino></túrquicos>

turistificación

It is about the impact that the visit or the massive call of tourists to it has on the inhabitants of a neighbourhood or a city, and that for this reason, the services, facilities and shops become oriented and conceived more towards tourists than on the citizen who lives in these neighbourhoods or cities permanently.

turiya

The Sanskrit meaning of the term turiya is precisely that of "fourth", so called because it is considered the fourth state of consciousness that the human being possesses, after wakefulness, dream with dreams and deep sleep.

turofilia

Passion and unbridled taste for cheese.

turofobia

It is said of the aversion or rejection of cheese, either because of its taste, smell or both.

uapití

The name elk comes from the language of the Shawnee Indians and means "deer with white hindquarters". The elk is related to deer but is much larger than most of its relatives.

ultracrepidario

Ultracrepidary. It is said of a noun that designates the typical person who speaks, opines or comments on topics or matters that he or she neither knows nor masters or even understands. It is composed of the Latin compositional element ultra- (beyond) and crepidarius (shoemaker of ancient Greece). It is used as a complement to the phrase "shoemaker to your shoes". It comes from the English <ultracrepidarian>>. </ultracrepidarian>

ultreia et suseia

Latin locution, used on the Camino de Santiago, which means, on the one hand, ultreia, "Let's go there" and its response, et suseia, means "Hallelujah!", for the celebration of walking to reach Santiago.

una imagen vale más que mil palabras

Popular saying or adage? That claims that a single still image (or any kind of visual representation) can convey complex ideas, thoughts? (single or multiple) and meanings more effectively and easily than a verbal or textual description.

unidad astronómica

Distance is said to be distance (with symbol au) used in astronomy as a unit of length for the typical dimensions of the Solar System. The International Astronomical Union defines 1 au as a length equal to exactly 149,597,870,700 meters.

unismo

It is said of a new philosophical current that seeks to recover the notion of the Neoplatonic One, considering it as a fulcrum and catalyst for understanding the universe, in which immanence and transcendence are one and the same.

uranofobia

It is said of the fear and/or aversion towards the concept of heaven as a place that only good people access, in which a state of anxiety is generated due to the fear and guilt of those who suffer it, since they think that they will be condemned when they die.

utopismo

1 . It refers to the philosophical, ideological, or political tendency that manifests and defends some kind of utopia or utopian approach. 2 . A literary genre in which utopias and their development are proposed.

va y viene

A colloquial expression that says about a person who is not committed to a particular issue or life in general.

vara de san josé

It is the name given to several species of a family of plants that grows in the forests of Caldas, Valle, Cauca and Putumayo. 2. In the Christian tradition, St. Joseph is always depicted with a flowered rod in his hand because, it is said that someone mocked him when he discovered that Mary was pregnant but he was not the progenitor, and challenged him: if he had really been an angel, his rod should have blossomed, and so it did. Another tradition says that the flowering of the rod is the miraculous sign with which Heaven indicated to the priests who should be Mary's husband.

vaticidio

Homicide (with or without intent) is said of any person, in the sense that the victim does not have any important reputation nor is he middle or upper class, but of ordinary people.

veganismo

2. It is said of an ethical principle that is totally contrary to the exploitation exercised by human beings towards the rest of the non-human animals. Veganism condemns all those situations in which there is human exploitation and domination over animals, which implies understanding and respecting the basic right of other animals not to be treated as means to the desires and purposes of human beings; which makes veganism a respect for all animals on the planet.

vegansexualidad

1 . It is said of a sexual option in which a vegan person causes rejection or for an ethical issue, avoids having sexual relations with people who are not vegan and thus, prefers to form bonds and intimate relationships with other people who share their same point of view on veganism. 2 . Vegan part of human sexuality, which advocates the non-use of products and services that are related to animal exploitation.

vegefobia

It is said of the aversion and rejection towards vegans and vegetarians, and everything related to veganism or vegetarianism.

vegetanismo

Vegetable-owned; socially consuming animal products; A way of life halfway between vegetarianism and veganism. Vegetarianism is a way of respecting animals and being able to share respect for them with other non-vegetarians without conflict.

vegetano

A person who practices a diet halfway between vegetarianism and veganism; With vegan tendencies, at a social level it allows the consumption of products derived from animals (eggs, cheese) but at a minimum level, not wearing any animal products in clothing.

vegetoide

It is said of the type of a vegetable-type being with the form and figure of a man; There are many types of them.

ventajismo

It is said of the attitude or way of proceeding that it is proper to an advantage-seeker; It is a set of actions that are unclear or unclean to be at an advantage over some person, team, or political party.

verso libre

Said of a person who does or says what he wants, sometimes without respecting the guidelines set by the group, without caring about the stridency or discomfort that it may cause among his colleagues.

viroide

1 . These are pathogens exclusive to plants and cause various diseases in plants, affecting their growth, development and reproduction. 2 . It refers to a group of infectious agents that, being distinct from viruses, are characterized by being small circular RNA molecules.

virósico

Virus quality; that has to do with viruses or their study.

virtudes

In angelology, the virtues, like the Dominations and the Powers, are of the second hierarchy; The virtues are considered to be the angels in charge of governing heaven, being responsible for the order of the universe. They have the duty to regulate the actions of the lower angels, but they also have the mission of supervising the behavior of people, inspiring them and endowing them with confidence to do good and serve the Divine.

vitaminar

It is said to add vitamins to something, usually to a food or diet.

vivir en las nubes

It is said of a popular expression that is usually said when talking about someone who is very distracted and does not realize what is happening around them.

vivir en los mundos de yupi

It is said of a colloquial expression, used mainly in Spain, which refers to a person who behaves oblivious to reality or to someone who lives a different and much more positive reality than the one perceived by others. It is similar to the expression <vivir en="" las="" nubes="">>> . </vivir>

vítae

A Latin word meaning "life", it is currently mostly used to mean curriculum vitae, which is a Latin phrase that literally means career of life.

vomirrea

It is said to suffer from diarrhea and vomiting at the same time, usually associated with stomach or digestive system discomfort.

vórtices

Plural of vortex; A whirlpool or whirlpool that moves in rotation around an axis, its direction can be centrifugal or centripetal.

winnie poh

Winnie-the-Pooh, who is also known as Winnie the Pooh in the Disney translations, and Winny de Puh in the original books translated into Spanish is a fictional character, he is an anthropomorphic teddy bear, short in stature, has yellow-orange fur and a round belly; It has black eyes, a black nose, a short muzzle and small, round ears. He is the subject of several books created by Alan Alexander Milne.

xantofobia

It is said of the fear, aversion or irrational rejection of the color yellow or yellowish tones.

xenoglosia

Derived from the Greek words xenos alien and gl?ssa lengua and meaning to speak in a foreign language, it is normally applied to describe speaking a language acquired by supernatural means.

xenografía

It is said of the science which describes foreign languages, the study of them, whether living or dead, and the study of their letters and symbols.

xenolalia

It comes from xenos alien and lalia hablar, and means "to speak in a foreign language". It refers to speaking or writing in a human language that has not been acquired by natural means

xenopolítica

It is the branch of politics that studies possible reactions, problems, and relationships with beings from other planets; How it would affect the population of the earth and what kind of diplomacy to apply depending on the beings that visit us, are aspects of xenopolitics.

xerofagia

It is said to feed on dry foods.

xixonés

A person born in Gijón, a city in Asturias (Spain). In Spanish it is written gijonés, being xixonés its version in bable or asturian, which is an autochthonous language of Asturias, which like other Romance languages, comes from Latin.

xunta

In Galicia, Spain, Xunta is used to describe a form of government, currently the autonomous government of Galicia is called Xunta de Galicia. In Spanish it's Junta.

yóguico

Yogics. It is said of that thing or person belonging to or relating to yoga.

zoopraxiscopio

It is a machine created in 1879 by Eadweard Muybridge. Prior to cinematography, he was able to project films which allowed the development of cinema as we understand it today.

zoónimos

A word used when using the proper name of an animal, composed of "zoo", animal and "onym" compositional element that is used especially to designate groups of words name or designation.

zurcefrenillos

It is said of someone who performs actions typical of a madman or nonsense.

ioh mi dios!

A phrase that expresses astonishment, fright or surprise in the face of a normally unexpected situation, it has become popular in the Spanish-speaking population by translating "oh my good" from English, widely used in that language.
