ad portas

alto turmequé

Turmequé: Colombian municipality located in the Department of Boyaca, its name is due to u indigenous word which means "Vigorous, strong " and in general they called it to the chieftain. and that resisted the colonization by the Espanoles.al putting the word high, metaphorical way is usually say to people that they come from strong, vigorous, place of resistance. also used to be in a place high in the Colombian mountainous system (system cundi-boyacense)

antifeudal

Anti-feudal: person or group of people who are against the system of feudal exploitation (fief = ground) as for the way they administer, social, political and religious, were usually those who rebelled against the Crown or Empire in the middle ages and which were slaughtered for being emancipatory. The Feudal era was characterized because the Lord distributed land to his vassals that they usufructuaran it and had to pay taxes by their exploitation, here come some tax known today as: toll, (10% of the total of 41 harvest tithe; those were paid in metallic material or in kind.

The phrase of comparison or metaphor, that complete means that a person in particular, quickly left a place where was towards another unknown (or known).
